MISCELLANEOUS ORDER

On December 22, 2018, the Court adopted a Temporary General Order to deal with the lapse in appropriations that impacted the Department of Justice and the United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Oklahoma.

Paragraph 5 of that Temporary General Order stayed all Chapter 7 and 13 cases within the Western District of Oklahoma wherein the United States or an agency, corporation, officer or employee, deemed or otherwise, of the United States was a party. All deadlines, response dates, due dates, and cut-off dates were extended for a period of time commensurate with the duration of the lapse in appropriations.

Paragraph 9 of that Temporary General Order required the United States Attorney's Office to notify the Court when Congress restored appropriations to the Department of Justice so that the Court could enter additional instructions and guidance.

The United States Attorney's Office notified the Court by letter to the Chief Judge on January 29, 2019, that the lapse in appropriations has ended and that the lapse of appropriations lasted for thirty-five (35) days.

Accordingly, any deadline extended as a result of the lapse in appropriations shall be resumed according to law.
